| Vocabulary | Definition |
|----------------|--|
| job | a paid position or occupation of regular employment. |
| careers | an occupation undertaken for a significant period of a person's life and with opportunities for progress. |
| paid | one receives pay (money/salary) for work |
| voluntary | working, done, or maintained without payment. |
| skill | the ability to use one's knowledge effectively and readily in execution or performance. |
| Attribute | a quality or feature regarded as a characteristic or inherent part of someone or something. |
| Qualification | a pass of an examination or an official completion of a course |
| college | an educational institution or establishment, in particular one providing higher education |
| apprenticeship | a paid job which offers hands-on work experience alongside off-the-job training. |
| university | a high-level educational institution in which students study for degrees and academic research is done. |
| stereotypes | a widely held but fixed and oversimplified image or idea of a particular type of job. Eg. only men can be builders or only women are nurses. |
