How can you use thematic maps?

Thematic maps are single-topic maps that focus on specific themes or phenomena, such as population density, rainfall and precipitation levels, vegetation distribution, and poverty

How can you describe climate zones?

Climate zones are areas with distinct climates. These zones might correspond to weather patterns, latitude, or communities of plants and animals.

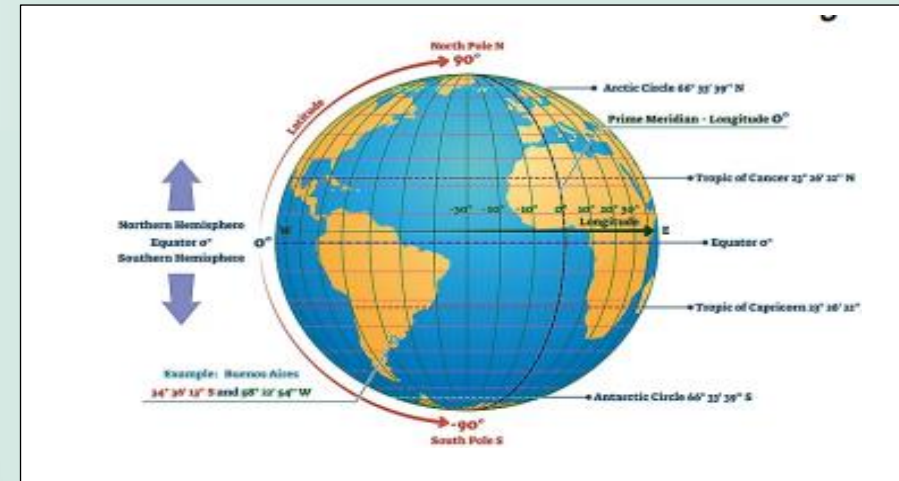
How do you read and use the scale bar on OS maps?

To measure distance is to count each square you cross on the map. On your OS map each grid square measures one kilometre

How can you describe biomes?

A biome is a large area on the earth's surface that is defined by the types of animals and plants living there.

Key Vocabulary

Vocabulary	Definition
Latitude	Longitudes are vertical lines that measure east or west of the meridian in Greenwich, England
Longitude	Latitudes are horizontal lines that measure distance north or south of the equator.
Equator	An equator is an imaginary line around the middle of the planet. It is halfway between the north pole and the south pole, at 0 degrees latitude.
Tropic of Cancer	The most northerly circle of latitude on Earth at which the Sun can be directly overhead.
Tropics of Capricorn	The most southerly circle of latitude on Earth at which the Sun can be directly overhead.
Arctic Circle	One of the two polar circles and the most northerly of the five major circle latitude as shown on maps.
Antarctic Circle	One of the two polar circle and the most southerly of the five major circle latitude as shown on maps.
Fair Trade	Fair Trade is a process used by organizations around the world to make sure that they buy and sell farm goods that have been produced from farms that pay a fair price to their farmers and for their materials.
