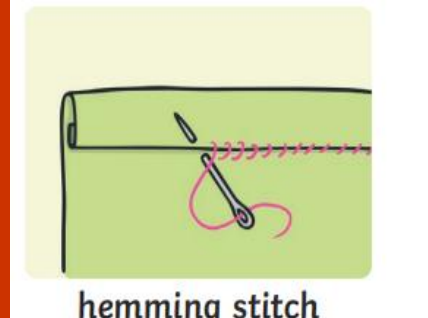
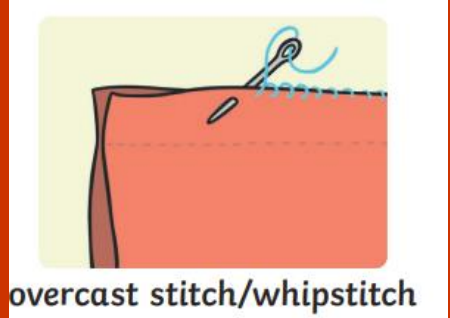
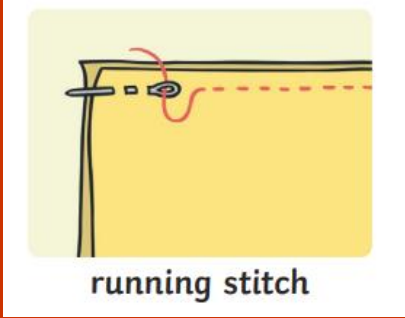


Key Vocabulary

Money containers	containers that hold money, that could be in different shapes or sizes.
pattern piece	the template (normally made from paper) from which the parts of a garment are cut from.
sew	join, fasten, or repair (something) by making stitches with a needle and thread or a sewing machine.
product	the final result of the design process which will match your design criteria.
purpose	the purpose of your design is the reason it is used to fulfil a certain objective e.g. the purpose of a purse is to carry money.



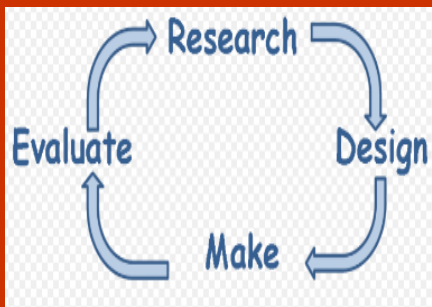
You can use different types of stitches.

Factors of design

- durability (how long it will last)
- cost
- appearance (is design and colour important to them?)
- safety (to ensure nothing falls out)

History of purses
