Vocabulary	Definition
behaviour	the way in which one acts or conducts oneself, especially towards others.
polite and courteous	have respectful manners and show behaviour considerate of other people.
respectful behaviour	showing politeness
rights and responsibilities	A right is a choice to make your own opinion and entitlement to things such as education, religion and freedom of speech. Responsibilities are duties or something an individual should do such as following the law and rules.
The International Rights of the Child	a legally-binding international agreement setting out the civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights of every child, regardless of their race, religion or abilities.
included	allow (someone) to share in an activity or privilege.
discriminated	make an unjust or prejudicial distinction in the treatment of different categories of people, especially on the grounds of ethnicity, sex, age, or disability.
disrespect	lack of respect or courtesy.
inappropriate	not suitable or proper in the circumstances.
exclusion	deny (someone) access to a place, group, or privilege.
privacy	the state of being free from public attention and not observed or disturbed by other people
