A bathing machine is a machine, used in Victorian times, to allow people at the beach to change out of their usual clothes into their swimwear.

A penny lick was a small glass used to serve ice cream. It cost one penny to buy and could be licked clean after eating.

**What are the differences between beach holidays-past and present?**

Some beaches were divided into men and women. Victorians didn't sunbath. They would go into the sea fully clothed. Activities would be Punch and Judy puppet shows and donkey rides.
