A: Don't share, names, numbers, addresses, passwords. NEVER arrange to meet others.

What do you do if you are worried or unsure?

A: Tell a trusted adult at home, school or mosque.

A: it is important to have rules, to ensure fairness and safety for everyone. These are the Laws in England that everyone can be expected to follow.

peer approval	when you choose to do something you wouldn't otherwise do, because you want to feel accepted and valued by your friends.
impact	to have a strong effect on
managing requests for personal info	Deciding if it is appropriate to share information
concerns	a question or condition that is difficult to understand or to deal with
inappropriate	not right or suited for some purpose or situation
anti-social	contrary to the laws of society, in a way that causes annoyance and disapproval in others.
law	a rule that states how people may and may not behave in a society
