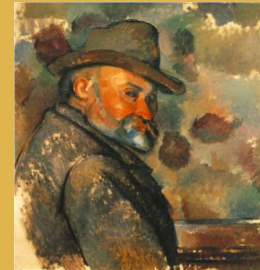
Who was Paul Cezanne?

Paul Cézanne

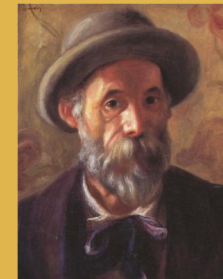
(19/01/1839 – 22/10/1906) was a French painter. He was born in Aix-en-Provence, in the south of France and died of pneumonia.

What technique did they use? Cezanne:

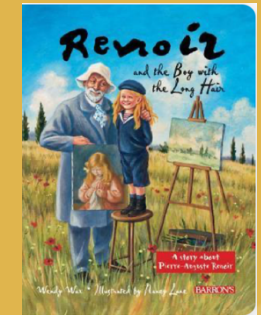
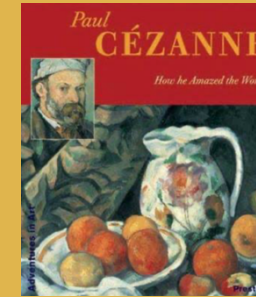
repeated small brush strokes — hatching and crosshatching. **Renoir:** broken brushstrokes and used bold complementary colours.

Who was Renoir?

Pierre-Auguste Renoir was born in Limoges, Haute-Vienne, France. As a boy, he worked in a porcelain factory where his drawing talents led to him being chosen to paint designs on fine china.

What will I create?

A sculpture; make surface patterns and textures on clay using modelling tools and: netting, small bubble wrap.

What is still life art?

Paintings feature an arrangement of objects. These are set and include organic objects like fruit, flowers and household items like glassware and textiles.

What techniques will I use?

Use water colours in stages, different brush sizes and mix different colours- blend patchy colours/brush strokes to create 3D effect.

Vocabulary	Definition
Still life	A work of art that shows objects from the natural or man-made world. Everyday objects like fruit and vegetables.
Tint	Tints are hues added with white.
Shade	Black can make a shade darker and white can brighten the shade.
Tone	Grey is used to change the tone of a colour; it makes a tone duller.
Texture	Texture refers to how something feels, including its appearance and consistency. Texture in art concerns the surface quality of a piece of work.
Pattern	A design that repeats and can be found anywhere. They can be a repeating, line or colour. Patterns can be simple like a checker board or complex like the branches of a tree.
Mould	Press into shape without breaking or cracking.
