How do you identify a river?

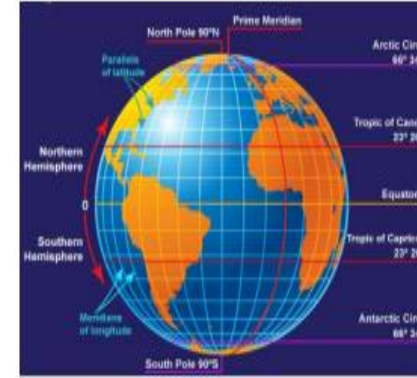
A river can be wide and deep, or shallow enough for a person to wade across. A flowing body of water that is smaller than a river is called a stream, creek, or brook.

Vocabulary	Definition
Southern hemisphere	The part of the earth that lies south of the equator.
Tropics of cancer and Capricorn	Two imaginary lines that circle the globe mark the boundaries of the tropics. The line called the Tropic of cancer marks the northern edge. The line called the Tropic of Capricorn marks the southern edge.
River	A body of water that flows downhill.
Stream, Brook, Creek	A flowing body of water smaller than a river.
County	An area of a country containing villages, towns and cities e.g. our county is Lancashire.
Country	Countries have their own governments and sports teams. There are 195 countries in the world.
