Tańczymy labada is a children's song from Poland.

Poland is a country in Europe.

The words in the song **Tańczymy labada** translate as

'Let's dance the labada, labada, labada,

Let's dance the labada, a funny waltz!'



Key Vocabulary

Vocabulary	Definition
Duration	beat, 4 beats per bar
Timbre	tuned percussion (chime bars, glockenspiel, xylophone), untuned percussion (claves, woodblocks, drums)
Texture	accompaniment
Pitch	notes F, C, G, and A.

Try saying these sounds very slowly, then build up speed:

- Tan – chee – me
- La – ba – da
- Shmeeesh – nay – go
- Val – chee – car

Poland has a long history of producing Classical composers. The most famous is Frédéric Chopin.

Examples of body percussion sounds you could use can be clicking fingers, chest tap, thigh slap, a clap or a stamp.

The song *Płynie statek* translates as 'A ship sails laden with bananas and all who load sing this song: "pass me the basket of bananas!"'
