Fly with the stars is a song in an electronic dance style, based on a verse/chorus structure using two chords – A minor and C major.

Action 1 represents two bars of A minor, and action 2 represents two bars of C major. This is repeated, lasting the whole length of the chorus.



Key Vocabulary

The introduction is two bars long (2 lots of four beats i.e. one count of 8) and is based on the chord A minor. The verse is constructed with 4 bars of A minor (shoulder rolls) followed by 2 bars of C major (stretching arms) – these are repeated.

The chorus has a different structure to the verse and looks like this:
A – C – A – C – A – C – A – C.

When you are working on a performance there are many things to ask yourself. How is it working? What needs further practise?

It is good to reflect on your performance. Did you feel confident? Have you become more confident since the last time you sang it? How have you improved since last singing it?

Duration	beat/pulse, crotchet ('walk'), quavers ('jogging'), crotchet rest ('shh'), 4/4, bar (4 beats), rhythm
Pitch	chords (A minor/Am, C major/C), drone
Structure	intro, verse, chorus, call-and-response, chord pattern
Timbre	drums, shakers, tuned percussion.
