

# LITTLE EXPLORER CHALLENGES

## SUMMER 2

Please find a selection of activities that you can enjoy doing with your child while at home. All of these activities link to our learning happening in Nursery.



### Dinosaur Footprints Hunt

Make dinosaur footprints using paper, cardboard, or socks dipped lightly in water. Hide them around the house and let children follow the tracks to find a "dinosaur egg" (a ball, toy, or crumpled paper).

### Roaring Dinosaur Sounds

Children practise different dinosaur roars: loud, quiet, sleepy, happy, stompy. Parents can ask, "What kind of dinosaur is this?" Great for language and confidence.

### Dinosaur Shape Hunt

Look around the home for circles, squares, and triangles and turn them into dinosaurs by adding eyes or tails with crayons.



### Dinosaur Movement Challenge

Move like different dinosaurs:

stomp like a T-Rex

fly like a Pterodactyl

stretch like a long-neck dinosaur

Helps gross motor skills and imagination.



### Make a Dinosaur Tail

Use a scarf, towel, or strip of paper tucked into trousers to make a tail. Children dance, stomp, and balance while pretending to be dinosaurs.

### Dinosaur Colour Sorting

Gather toys or objects and sort them by colour into "dinosaur nests." Example: green leaves for green dinosaurs, red socks for red dinosaurs.

### Dinosaur Story Time Drawing

Ask children to draw where dinosaurs lived: volcanoes, jungles, caves, or swamps. They can explain their picture to an adult.
